Asheville, Nashville in September

Grand homes, grand hotels and the Grand Ole Opry highlight our trip South as we visit Asheville, NC., Nashville, Tenn., and Lexington, Ken. **Tuesday Sept. 13 through Sunday, Sept. 18**. During our 5-night, sixday sojourn we'll tour Biltmore Estate, drive through the beautiful Smoky Mountains, visit Nashville— America's Music City also known as the Athens of the South— see the historic Ryman Auditorium, tour Andrew Jackson's Hermitage, take in a show at the Grand Ole Opry, visit a Shaker Village, overnight in Kentucky's horse country and enjoy lunch overlooking West Viriginia's New River Gorge.

We'll depart from the Village Center Tuesday morning and arrive in time for a tour of Lee Chapel and Museum at Washington and Lee University in Lexington, Va. Then we'll have lunch in a 1820s setting at the Willson-Walker House. That evening we'll dine overlooking the mountains of North Carolina at the impressive Grove Park Inn. The inn, which will be our home for the two nights, is consistently ranked among the nation's top resorts. Furnished in arts and crafts style, the inn features fireplace lounges, waterfalls and a world-class spa.

After a sumptuous breakfast in the Blue Ridge Dining Room, we're off to Biltmore Estate, a 250-room French Renaissance-style chateau built by George Vanderbilt. Following lunch on your own at Biltmore, our guide will take us on a driving tour of Asheville, where we'll learn about some of the town's most famous residents, including Thomas Wolfe.

Winner of the *Seventeen* fiction contest at the age of sixteen, her writing has appeared in several magazines and newspapers including *The New York Times* and *The Washington Post*.




Crack into a few crabs at our feast

Then it's back to the Grove Park to relax until a dinner and wine-tasting at The Grape Escape in downtown Asheville. The following morning we'll depart Asheville and arrive at our home for the next two nights, the extraordinary Opryland Resort in Nashville. Our Atrium level accommodations will feature views of one of the three indoor gardens. One garden, the Delta, has its own river, which is large enough to carry passengers on flat boats. That evening, we'll enjoy a progressive dinner and tours at two historic homes in Nashville. Dinner will be served at Travellers Rest Plantation, a 1799 Federal-style farmhouse that offers a glimpse of how wealthy Nashvillians lived in the early 19th century. Dessert will be served at Belmont Mansion, the 1850s summer home of Joseph and Adelicia Acklen. The beautiful and aristocratic Mrs. Acklen is said to have been a model for Margaret Mitchell's Scarlett O'Hara.

The following morning, we'll explore downtown Nashville with our local guide and visit the legendary Ryman Auditorium, the home of the Grand Ole Opry from 1943 to 1974. The building, originally the Union Gospel Tabernacle, became a popular venue for theatrical and musical performances and political rallies. Arthur's, in the historic Union Station Hotel, is the setting where

Pulitzer Prize winner to speak at **Village Center**

Linda Greenhouse, correspondent for The New York Times and America's preeminent Supreme Court reporter, will discuss her book, Becoming Justice Blackmun, at



the Village Center on Thursday, July 14, at 7:30 p.m.

Justice Harry A. Blackmun, who served on the court from 1970 to 1994, is best remembered as the author of the most controversial decision of his era, Roe v. Wade. Appointed by Richard Nixon, Justice Blackmun became the Supreme Court's most liberal justice after the retirement of William Brennan and Thurgood Marshall.

Ms. Greenhouse was the first print reporter to have access to Justice Blackmun's extensive archive and his private and public papers. She has covered the Supreme Court for The Times since 1978 and won a Pulitzer Prize in 1998 for her coverage of the court. She appears regularly on the PBS program "Washington Week in Review."

When military forces invaded Iraq in March 2003, 600 journalists were "embedded" with the troops. Katherine Skiba, a reporter and photographer, was the sole female civilian among the 2,300 soldiers of the 159th Aviation Brigade, whose pilots flew Black Hawk and Chi-

nook helicopters into the thick of battle. She will discuss her riveting memoir, Sister In The Band Of *Brothers: Embedded With The 101st Airborne In Iraq, at the* Village Center on Thursday, July 28, at 7:30 p.m.

Ms. Skiba, the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel's Washington correspondent, had already covered such global hot spots as the Gaza Strip, Kosovo, and the Soviet Union when she took the assignment to go to Iraq. She was one of only 60 female reporters to go to Iraq. Her daily dispatches were a vital lifeline between the troops and their families and earned her a grateful national audience. And her book gives a no-holds-barred account of war's grim reality.


Three cheers for area artists

Honorable Mention. Winners will be selected by exhibit juror, David Daniels. Mr. Daniels is an accomplished watercolorist who teaches painting at





It was where Frank Sinatra first appeared with the Tommy Dorsey Orchestra and later with Harry James' band. It was one of the first stages to present Vaudeville and motion pictures combined and maintained a house orchestra at the theatre well into the 1950's. It closed in 1990 when it was the last operating movie theatre in downtown Baltimore. Now the curtain rises again at the Hippodrome after a lengthy restoration.



Village Council Corner

Property Tax Appeals

Per the Council resolution on May 2, 2005, the Village attorney reviewed the validity of the disproportionately high land values placed on condominium units during the recent re-assessment of Village property. He agreed with the Council's position that the values were difficult to support in light of the land values placed on rental apartment buildings—both in total dollars and in proportion to the total land and improvement values. Although the assessment office followed the statutory requirements of valuing land and improvements separately, since the land values were not based on an independent appraisal of the actual market value of the land itself, he felt that total assessed valuations may or may not be reduced if an owner prevailed in getting the State to reduce the land value.

The Coucil will continue to seek legal opinions on issues that may have a significant effect on the rights of Village taxpayers.

Appreciation is expressed to the State of Maryland Department of Assessments and Taxation for allowing Village property owners to meet with the assessors at the Village Center rather than at its Rockville offices.
